SPRING TRIP, 2009 One of the highlights of last year was our trip to Arizona to visit my sister and brother-in-law, Donna and Al. It was Ron's first trip to the Southwest. We spent most of the week traveling with them in northeastern AZ. We drove through the Salt River Canyon to the town of Show Low. From there we drove by the Petrified Forest, through miles of Navajo reservation, to Canyon De Chelly (pronounced De Shay) where we spent the day driving the south rim of this canyon. It is an amazing place with cliff dwellings dating from the Anasazi, "The Ancient Ones". We hope to go back someday and take a guided tour of the canyon floor with Donna and Al.

Next we drove to the Grand Canyon and spent the day visiting the South Rim (we seem to be stuck on South rims). The canyon is truly one big, incredible, hole (Ron's description) in the ground. It was a first visit to Canyon De Chelly and the Grand Canyon for all of us. A great time was had by all!

The next day we drove through Oak Creek Canyon, Sedona, then south through Red Rock Canyon and back to the Phoenix area. Each of the canyons we visited had their own personality, beauty and drama but we were more impressed by Canyon De Chelly than the others because of the cliff dwellings and an "**other world**" feeling that projects from the canyon.

We ended our trip in Washington and Oregon to visit more of my family. We held our family reunion to celebrate my mother turning 91 years old in January. Most of my family came from near and far to attend this wonderful event. It has been a long time since we had so many of us together at one time. Ron and I also had a day to photograph hunting/retriever dogs at my brother's Cedarville Farms hunting club near Oakville, WA. The day was perfect and so were the dogs. Their owners were fun, too!

SOUTH DAKOTA, 2009 Our 16th summer as artists-in-residence at a resort in the beautiful Black Hills of South Dakota, started in early July and continued until the end of

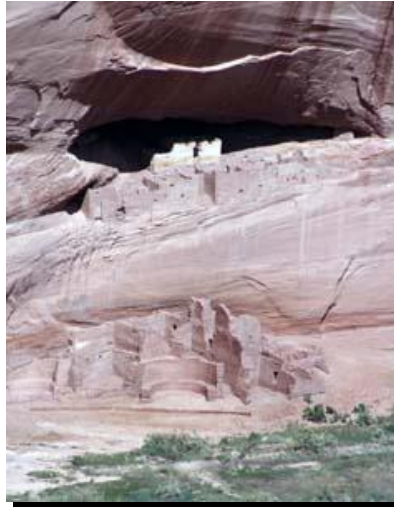
